St. Patrick Day Celebration

On March 17th, we will Commemorate our Patron Saint, St. Patrick, by the **Mass for St. Patrick at 6:30 p.m.** followed by a Pot Luck Supper. More details to follow.

As St. Patrick is our Patron Saint, The Feast of St Patrick in our parish is celebrated as a solemnity. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but it still ranks high enough as a holy day that the requirement for fasting is suspended. This is according to Canon Law (Canon #1251)

You do not have to abstain from meat on March 17th.

Fasting and Abstinence Rules:

Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are mandatory days of **fasting** for Catholics within the age range of 18 through 59.

Minimum requirements for fasting:

One full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals are also permitted but these smaller meals should not add up to a full meal. Snacks between meals **are not** permitted.

Water, coffee, and tea may be consumed throughout the day. People may engage in stricter forms of fasting if they choose but, for appropriate health reasons, people may be excused from fasting.

Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and <u>all</u> Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

This means abstaining from eating meat. Seafood and eggs are permitted. This rule applies to Catholics age 14 and over.

To help defray the cost of *Altar flowers for Easter*, donation envelopes are in the Narthex.

You may donate 'In Memory of' **or** 'In Honor of' a loved one or friend.

Names will be listed in the Easter Sunday bulletin on April 9th, **and** the Divine Mercy Sunday bulletin on April 16th.





Black History Month is observed every February and has been so for a number of years. It is a good time to highlight the history of the Catholic Church in the United States from an African-American perspective.

Julia Greeley is a woman not well known but is important to the American Church because she has bee proposed for canonization. Known as the Angel of Denver was born in the 1830's (exact date was not recorded for slaves) at Hannibal, Missouri, of unknown parentage. We do know they were slaves. While still a child her right eye was destroyed by a cruel slave master when the whip with which he was beating her mother accidently caught her eye.

Freed after the Civil War, she continued serving white families as a cook, a housekeeper, and a servant in Missouri, Wyoming, New Mexico, and Colorado finally settling in Denver. Julia began assisting poor families in her neighborhood. While her own resources were meager, she was able to help others by begging for food, fuel, and clothing. To avoid embarrassing those that she helped, Julia did most of her charitable work at night. One time she visited a home and saw the children sleeping on the floor. She begged a mattress when she delivered to them after carrying it across town on her back!

In 1880, Julia was received into the Catholic Church at Sacred Heart parish in Denver. The Jesuits who staffed the parish considered her and their best and most enthusiastic promoter of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. She handed out devotional literature at every opportunity, each month she walked to every fire station in Denver to give the firemen literature from the Sacred Heart League. She had great devotion to the presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and attended Mass daily. She continued to help the poor until she died in 1918. Because she lived in a boarding house, her body was laid out in the parish church. Hundreds of people filed by her casket and attended her funeral. Many requested that her cause for canonization be introduced in Rome. This was done in 2016.

Originally buried in a local cemetery, on June 7, 2017 her remains were transferred to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Denver in preparation for her eventual canonization.

Baptism

- Parents <u>must be registered</u> at St. Patrick and attend Mass for 3 months before preparation.
- * Parents must attend Baptism Prep Class so, please **call the office** to register for class!
- * Godparents are invited to attend Baptism class.
- * At least <u>one</u> godparent must be a Catholic good standing.
- * Non St. Patrick godparents must provide a sponsorship letter from their home parish office. The letter must be received by St. Patrick Church office **prior to** requesting a date for the Baptism.

Marriage – Couples <u>must</u>:

- * Contact the pastor <u>at least</u> **6 months** (or more) <u>prior</u> to desired wedding date.
- * Complete FOCCUS inventory
- * Participate in a pre-Cana course or marriage-prep weekend.
- * <u>NO</u> wedding date is guaranteed until <u>ALL</u> Diocesan and Parish requirements are fulfilled.

First Communion and Confirmation

- * Family must be registered at St. Patrick.
- * Preparation = two years of classes.
- * Children must be at least **7 years old** to receive First Communion, **and** at least **14 years old** to receive Confirmation.
